- <u>Cambridge researchers join new initiative on urban air pollution</u> Researchers from the Department of Chemistry
 at the University of Cambridge are part of a cutting-edge project to better understand Londoners' exposure to air
 pollution and improve air quality in the capital.
- Cambridge partners with industry leaders to fund research on global sustainability challenges. The Prince of
 Wales Global Sustainability Fellowship Programme, hosted at the Cambridge Institute for Sustainability
 Leadership (CISL) represents a multi-million-pound commitment from the private sector to accelerate progress

- £10 million research competition launched to tackle antimicrobial resistance. The competition aims to encourage the development of innovative scientific approaches to stopping antimicrobial resistance and to infection control and prevention.
- Wellcome launches £250m Leap Fund to place big bets on bold research Wellcome is to launch a new £250m fund that will place big bets on ambitious research programmes with the potential to fundamentally change science or transform health over a five- to ten-year horizon.
- Implications of UK-EU negotiations for development and aid examined. The International Development
 Committee took evidence from the Secretary of State for International Development on UK-EU development
 cooperation and the implications for UK aid on 17th July 2018.
- Money woes undermine pan-African science guidance Africa's persistent lack of research funding could

- Low quality healthcare is increasing the burden of illness and health costs globally. Poor quality health services are holding back progress on improving health in countries at all income levels, according to a new joint report by the OECD, World Health Organization (WHO) and the World Bank.
- ODI publishes 'Leave no one behind' index 2018 This index reviews the readiness of 86 countries to 'leave no
 one behind', monitoring the extent to which government systems are set up and ready to meet their leave no
 one behind commitment.
- <u>UN central platform reviews progress towards meeting the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the SDGs</u> The High-level Political Forum (HLPF), United Nations central platform for follow-up and review of the

- 2030 Agenda is meeting in New York under the theme 'Transformation towards sustainable and resilient societies'.
- <u>UK Collaborative on Development Research launched</u> The UK Collaborative on Development Research (UKCDR), a group of government departments and research funders working in international development, has launched a new brand and strategy.
- Think tank ODI publishes briefing: Water and sanitation, migration and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable
 Development This briefing considers the impact of migration on a variety of WASH-related Sustainable
 Development Goals (SDGs), chiefly SDG 6: 'to ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all'.
- <u>Lord Ahmad publishes annual Human Rights Report 2017</u> Minister for Human Rights Lord Tariq Ahmad of Wimbledon, publishes the Foreign and Commonwealth Office's 2017 annual Human Rights and Democracy Report.
- <u>Measuring Up' Report on UK performance in meeting SDGs published by UKSSD</u> UK Stakeholders for Sustainable Development Group (UKSSD) in partnership with the All-Party Parliamentary Group for the UN Global Goals for Sustainable Development launched the Measuring Up report: a snapshot of how the UK is performing on the SDGs ahead of the country's voluntary 2019 national review.
- <u>'Pathways to change': IIED publishes its annual report 2017/18</u> The International Institute for Environment and Development presented its 2017/18 annual report in June.
- <u>DfID publishes individual country programmes for the financial years 2018/18 and 2019/20</u> The Department for International Development (DfID) has published a set of country profiles detailing its country programmes contribute to delivering the UK aid strategy for the financial years 2018/19 to 2019/2020.
- 2018 SDG Index and Dashboards Report 'Global Responsibilities Implementing the Goals' published The
 2018 SDG Index and Dashboards Report, prepared by the Bertelsmann Stiftung and the Sustainable
 Development Solutions Network (SDSN), is now available. This third edition of the annual stocktaking of progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) presents data for all 193 UN member states and assesses whether countries are on track to meet each of the 17 SDGs.
